All children are active during the Daily Mile.
All children have 2 hours of taught PE sessions per week - (2 days of PE coach from Sports UK)

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

All children are to complete a baseline for the Daily Mile, timings to be completed by PE coach/class teacher to evidence improvement/progression.
Further pupil voice to be gained from pupils throughout the year, with a skills focus and feedback from tournaments attended. Parent voice for additional sports clubs required.
Track the demographics of groups participating in extracurricular activities and tournaments.


